OUR FABULOUS CREEK!

As a part of our community-building focus for the start of the year, the Year 2 cohort dedicated several lessons to playing in the Tatachilla creek together. The children loved it and we saw so much benefit from the activities the children were engaging in, that we decided to continue this and spend a lesson engaged in nature play every week.

There are many documented benefits of nature play, including:

- Communing with and appreciating nature
- Improving the ability to take risks safely
- Building resilience sometimes we fall but we get back up again
- Developing our imagination through using objects from nature for new purposes in our play
- Collaborating and enjoying each other's company
- Physical development of muscle groups as we climb, swing, drag logs and dig the ground this then supports our fine motor development for handwriting
- Sensory experiences

When asked what they most enjoyed, the children in Year 2 named; making cubbies, tree climbing, rope swinging as well as creating stews, muffins and cakes in the mud kitchen.





For our new students, they have enjoyed new friends teaching them how to climb the tree and swing on the rope safely. The creek was described as 'fun, beautiful and exciting!'

Our creek had a revamp over the Christmas school holidays, and a brand-new bridge was constructed. The whole area is impressive, but the bridge has become a unique feature. We are very thankful for this precious area and the learning, development and fun we experience there.
