In particular, the personal and social capabilities, which cover aspects such as making responsible decisions, working effectively in teams and regulating emotions, help students understand themselves and others better, and at this time of the year, help students to reach the end-of-year finish line feeling proud of not only what they have achieved, but the manner in which they got there.



Congratulations to our very talented athletes **Grace Deacon**, **Tessa Ebert** and **Seth Read** who have been selected in the South Australian 12 & Under Track and Field Team. They will compete against the best athletes in Australia on Friday 23 to Tuesday 27 November in Melbourne. We wish them all the best!

Congratulations also to four Tatachilla students who represented the school in Athletics at the All Schools Championships last weekend. Jordan McMillan came away with a silver in the 100m and 200m races and won gold in the 400m. Grace Deacon won a silver medal in the 400m only just missing out on the gold and running a PB of 1 minute 2 seconds. Grace also ran a PB in the 800m of 2 minutes 27 seconds coming 4th and only just missing out on a bronze medal. Nicholas Schroder won a gold medal in the U/14 90m hurdles and a silver medal in the U/14 long jump. Angus Hincksman won a gold in the 17 & Under 800m Para with a meet record of 2:28.04, a bronze in the U16 200m Para 15.28sec and a bronze in the U16 100m Para with a PB of 31.04sec.
