HEAD OF JUNIOR SCHOOL



We look forward to welcoming our Junior School families and students next Monday. Over the past few weeks, administration, grounds and teaching staff have been preparing for the coming year. A lot of maintenance work is done over the break, including carpet cleaning and repainting; and this week, all College staff come together for professional learning and training.

The Junior School will also welcome seven new staff members. They too, have been on site for induction and familiarisation sessions. We are confident that they are bringing skills, knowledge and understanding that will complement the Junior School community, and the teaching and learning that takes place here every day.

In the Sunday mail last weekend, an article by Rebecca Baker, 'Help your kids beat those first day blues', acknowledged that some children will feel anxious about returning to school after a long break; and this is particularly so for children starting at a new school. The advice from psychologist, Kirrilie Smout, quoted in the article is well worth heeding. Working alongside our caring classroom teachers, we have additional staff who will be on hand in the mornings to welcome and support the children as the term begins. Any concerns about the first days of school can be raised with your child's class teacher, and we encourage you to come to the open classrooms on Thursday afternoon to see your child's classroom and greet the teachers.

BACK TO SCHOOL ROUTINES

If your children are a bit out of their school bedtime routine, now is a good time to start re-establishing it. Being well rested is one of the critical foundation stones for a child's ability to learn, and engage in the busyness of school life.

NEW ARRANGEMENTS FOR STUDENT STATIONERY

In previous years, stationery was ordered and paid for on line by parents, and delivered to the student's home. Starting this year, all stationery has been ordered by the College and has been delivered direct to the College. Teachers will issue stationery to the students as it is needed throughout the year. PVC book covers will be used to cover exercise books, and teachers have prepared title pages to identify what each book is used for.

PARENT INFORMATION NIGHTS

Junior School Parent Information Sessions are held in the first weeks of term. These provide an opportunity to hear about the year ahead from your child's class teacher.

Reception Information Evening is Tuesday 6th February. Years 1 to 6 are held on Tuesday 13th February. More detail about the programme will be issued shortly. A 30 minute information session will also be held in the Activity Room where John Dow (Head of JS), Emma Williams (Assistant Head- Student Wellbeing), Ali Thacker (Assistant Head – Teaching and Learning), and Karen Turner (JS Learning Enhancement Coordinator) will present 2018 key initiatives for Reception to Year 6.

RECEPTION TEMPORARY ACCOMMODATION

Nestling quietly beside the big shed are the three temporary classrooms for our Reception classes. These buildings arrived in early January. They were brought in by truck and craned into place on the site prepared for them at the end of last year. Since then, Ron Armstrong, Property Services Manager, and his team have been working steadily on the exterior steps and decking required for access, plus a weather proof roof between the classrooms and the toilet block. The interiors are also being refurbished with fresh paint, new LED lighting, sink cupboards, and just prior to the work being finished, the pin boards, whiteboards and some shelving will be moved across from the Reception Centre. The Reception classes will take up residence from Week 6.

LABEL EVERYTHING

If you have ever visited the Junior School office, you may have seen a large wicker hamper there. It is usually full to the brim of school jumpers, hats and other uniform items. The common bond that these items share is that they are not named. Please ensure you label all your children's uniform items, their lunch box, water bottle, and anything else they bring to school.

HATS AND WATER

With a warm start to the term likely, hats are essential at recess and lunch time. Our policy is, 'No hat, play in the shade', and if it is very hot, we all stay inside or out of the sun during breaks.

Water bottles may be brought into the classroom, but they should not be frozen, as condensation builds up on the outside of the bottle, resulting in a puddle on the table.

In hot weather, a freezer block in the lunchbox will help to keep it cool.

JUNIOR SCHOOL CLASS BLOGS

Rather than individual class blog sites, this year a centralised blog site has been established where each year level is represented. Families with children in more than one year level, will now have only one blog platform to learn and visit. This will be one of our main forms of communication between school and home and will be launched and explained at the Parent Information Evenings, so maximum attendance is encouraged.

LINES OF COMMUNICATION, SUPPORT AND CARE IN THE MIDDLE SCHOOL

Towards the end of 2017 we announced that Mr Mike Ebert would be the Assistant Head of Middle School: Student Wellbeing, whilst maintaining his role as Year 7 Coordinator. Jenna Fowler is Year 8 Coordinator and Darren Vile is Year 9 Coordinator. Michelle Coop is the Assistant Head of MS/SS: Teaching and Learning. The first point of contact for students and parents is their Home Class teachers, then Year Level Coordinator, then Assistant Head of School in Wellbeing or Teaching and Learning, then Head of Middle School and then Principal.

MIDDLE SCHOOL ORIENTATION PROGRAM - WEEK 1 TERM 1

This year students and families will feel a fresh change as students will engage in a number of purpose filled learning experiences across the first week that assists students in gaining confidence and success as they transition into the new year. FIRST DAY OF SCHOOL – MONDAY 29 JANUARY

The school buses will be operating on this day. Students are to meet at their Home Class rooms by 8:40am with their bags. Parents/caregivers are welcome to come to drop off in the Middle School. Students are required to wear their Sports Uniform and should bring their named pencil case, hat, drink bottle, recess and lunch for the day. All other stationery items are included in the school fees in 2018. Items will be distributed to students during orientation days. The Canteen will be open from Monday. This day will finish at 3:20pm, where parents/caregivers can collect students from their Home Class rooms/carpark, or students can utilise the bus.

A tour of the Middle School and an opportunity to meet other parents will commence at 8:55am in the Middle School Courtyard.

R-12 OPENING WORSHIP SERVICE – WEDNESDAY 31 JANUARY

Students will meet at their Home Class room and then will move to an R-12 Opening Worship at 8:55am with their Home Class Teacher to the College's Gym. Parents are more than welcome to join us in this Opening Worship. Once this Worship Service has finished students will move into scheduled orientation activities.

Students are required to complete the following to prepare their devices for use in 2018:

- Update MacOS. This should be done at home and must be done in order to be able to work on your computer.
 NOTE: Do not close down your computer while this update is occurring. Instructions for update:

 - 3. Upgrade to MacOS High Sierra V10.13.1
- Ensure you have installed Self-Service by enrolling in CASPER. This allows you to access software required for learning. Instructions for update:

STATIONERY

COLLEGE CALENDAR

COLLEGE SMARTPHONE APP

A reminder that our free Smartphone App is available for download from the iTunes Store or Google Play. Information about College events, news and the Newsletter are available through the App. In addition, if you subscribe to notifications you will get alerts when we send out notifications for such information as reminders for tasks to be completed, up-to-date time travel of camps and in the event of an emergency, specific information related to this. You are encouraged to download the App.

ABSENTEE NOTIFICATION

It is important that we have accurate and timely information regarding the attendance of students. In the event that you have not informed the College of your child's absence, you will receive an SMS to notify you that your child has been marked absent from school. This message will also ask you to contact the College to confirm their absenteeism. As always, if your child is going to be absent from school, you can call the College Absentee Line, 24/7, on 8329 4444 or send a message through the Smartphone App.

SEQTA: ENGAGE

We invite parents/caregivers to make regular weekly visits to Seqta: Engage, your online portal to the teaching and learning communications of the College are located. For our Middle and Senior School families this is also where regular assessment, feedback, results and grades are provided by teachers.

Students also have access to their portal through SEQTA: Learn where you can also sit with them, discuss the feedback and results from teachers and plan goals and areas of improvement.

New families will recently have received an email to log in to SEQTA: Engage and activate your account. Continuing families should still have access from 2017. UNIFORM

Throughout 2018, staff will be ensuring that students are adhering to the Uniform Guidelines and we ask for your continued support in these endeavours.

Students bring a range of items to school each day which can be misplaced. In order to give the best chance of a drink bottle, a hat or a jumper finding its way back home, please make sure you clearly label all your child's belongings. You may need to reapply this throughout the year.

SUN SAFETY

While sunscreen is available in some key areas of the College such as SSO's and Gym, students are encouraged to apply sunscreen before they leave home each day. In these summer days students continue to participate in outside activities both during break times and in class times.

Hats are to be worn by all students during Terms 1, 3 and 4. Likewise, sunglasses are able to be worn during break times, but are to be removed when inside.
