## from the HEAD OF JUNIOR SCHOOL



Welcome to the 2019 school year. We look forward to welcoming all students on Wednesday 30 January, including our Reception students. This year we have around 115 new students starting in classrooms right across the Junior School, including our additional Year 5

and 6 students who make up the three classes at those year levels.

A lot of maintenance work is done over the break, including carpet cleaning and repainting. The bag racks outside the upper primary classrooms have been replaced with bag hooks which is a significant aesthetic improvement. Final touches have been given to the Reception Centre building and surrounding landscaping. The major project completed over the break has been the new pathway along the western side of the oval, which looks fantastic and has improved the overall appearance of that area. Many thanks to Brett Sharrad and his team who have worked out in the heat to have this complete for the start of the school year.

Junior School staff have been in over the break preparing their learning spaces, attending meetings and professional development. Nearly all teaching staff have moved to a new classroom, which has provided an opportunity to cull resources and de-clutter. Over the next few weeks, most classrooms will get some new furniture. The existing desks and chairs will be supplemented with larger tables to allow students to collaborate more readily, and to provide students with a bit more choice about where they sit. We also hope to provide additional outdoor bench and table settings to take advantage of the outdoor undercover areas as learning spaces.

The Junior School will also welcome seven new and returning staff members. They too, have been on site for induction and familiarisation sessions. We are confident that they are bringing skills, knowledge and understanding that will complement the Junior School community, and the teaching and learning that takes place here every day.

The first few days of school can be an anxious time for some students. #### ARRANGEMENTS FOR STUDENT STATIONERY

As per the new system introduced last year, all stationery has been ordered by the College and has been delivered direct to the College. Teachers will issue it to the students as it is needed throughout the year. PVC book covers will be used to cover exercise books, and teachers have prepared title pages to identify what each book is used for. Exercise books will not be sent home for covering, although you may be asked to name the pens and pencils required for Term 1. You may also be asked to provide a pencil case.

#### **BACK TO SCHOOL ROUTINES**

If your children are a bit out of their school bedtime routine, now is a good time to start re-establishing it. Being well rested is one of the critical foundation stones for a child's ability to learn, and engage in the busyness of school life.

#### PARENT INFORMATION NIGHTS

The Junior School Parent Information Night (PIN) will be held for all year levels on Tuesday 12 February. More detail about the programme will be issued shortly. A 30 minute information session will also be held in the Activity Room where John Dow (Head of JS), Lindee Hopkins (Assistant Head- Student Wellbeing), Ali Thacker (Assistant Head – Teaching and Learning), and Karen Turner (Learning Enhancement R-6 Coordinator) will present 2019 key initiatives for Reception to Year 6.

A sausage sizzle will be provided, and there will be plenty of time to meet your child's teacher and other parents in the year level. We hope all Junior School families will be able to attend.

#### LABEL EVERYTHING

If you have ever visited the Junior School office, you may have seen a large wicker hamper there. It is usually full to the brim of school jumpers, hats and other uniform items. The common bond that these items share is that they are not named. Please ensure you label all your children's uniform items, their lunch box, water bottle, and anything else they bring to school.

#### HATS AND WATER

With a warm start to the term likely, hats are essential at recess and lunch time. Our policy is, 'No hat, play in the shade', and if it is very hot, we all stay inside or out of the sun during breaks.

Water bottles may be brought into the classroom, but they should not be frozen, as condensation builds up on the outside of the bottle, resulting in a puddle on the table.

In hot weather, a freezer block in the lunch box will help to keep it cool.

We also recommend the use of insulated lunch boxes and freezer blocks. These are proven to keep student lunches cool even on very hot days.

#### JUNIOR SCHOOL CLASS BLOGS

The Junior School has a centralised blog site where year level is represented. Families with children in more than one year level have only one blog platform to learn and visit. This is a main forms of communication between school and home. A link and password will be shared with all families soon.

## LINES OF COMMUNICATION, SUPPORT AND CARE IN THE MIDDLE SCHOOL

#### STATIONERY REQUIREMENTS

## **GENERAL INFORMATION**

#### **COLLEGE CALENDAR**

In the first week of school, the youngest child in each family will receive a small College calendar. We encourage you to place this somewhere prominent in your house as many key details for our year can be found in the calendar. As always there are many events on throughout the year. The calendar, along with our website, newsletter, Facebook page, Twitter page and Skoolbag App are all ways that you can stay in touch on a daily basis.

#### **COLLEGE SKOOLBAG APP**

A reminder that our free Skoolbag App is available for download from the iTunes Store or Google Play. Information about College events, news and newsletters are available through the App. In addition, if you subscribe to notifications you will get alerts when we send out notifications for such information as reminders for tasks to be completed, up-todate time travel of camps and in the event of an emergency, specific information related to this. You are encouraged to download the App.

#### **ABSENTEE NOTIFICATION**

It is important that we have accurate and timely information regarding the attendance of students. In the event that you have not informed the College of your child's absence, you will receive an sms to notify you that your child has been marked absent from school. This message will also ask you to contact the College to confirm their absenteeism. As always, if your child is going to be absent from school, you can call the College Absentee Line, 24/7, on 8329 4444 or send a message through the Smartphone App.

#### **UNIFORM**

The Uniform Guidelines can be found on the College website at <u>www.tatachilla.sa.edu.au/enrolments/uniform</u>. Please take the time to ensure that you have the required items for your child and that you discuss with them the requirements for dress and appearance at the College. Please note that any hair below collar length must be tied back, male or female. Throughout 2019 staff will be ensuring that students are adhering to the Uniform Guidelines and we ask for your continued support in these endeavours.

#### **SUN SAFETY**

While sunscreen is available in some key areas of the College such as SSOs and Gym, students are encouraged to apply sunscreen before they leave home each day. In these summer days students continue to participate in outside activities both during break times and in class times.

Hats are to be worn by all students during Terms 1, 3 and 4. Likewise, sunglasses are able to be worn during break times, but are to be removed when inside.

#### NAME ITEMS

Students bring a range of items to school each day which can be misplaced. In order to give the best chance of a drink bottle, a hat or a jumper finding its way back home, please make sure you clearly label all your child's belongings. You may need to reapply this throughout the year.

#### SEQTA: ENGAGE

We invite parents/caregivers to make regular weekly visits to Seqta: Engage, your online portal to the teaching and learning communications of the College are located. For our Middle and Senior School families this is also where regular assessment, feedback, results and grades are provided by teachers.

Students also have access to their portal through SEQTA: Learn where you can also sit with them, discuss the feedback and results from teachers and plan goals and areas of improvement.

New families will receive an email to log in to SEQTA: Engage to activate your account. Continuing families should still have access from 2018. If you have any trouble logging in please contact our ICT Helpdesk through the College Administration Office or ictservices@tatachilla.sa.edu.au

#### CANTEEN

From 2019 the College Canteen will be managed by Rory's School Lunches. Rory's School Lunches is a local based catering and canteen management company who provide excellent and extensive "healthy choice" food offerings to numerous schools across South Australia.

The new canteen will open on Wednesday 30 January from 8am. Students who place lunch orders will be able to order from the menu that is available on QKR app or on the Rory's website at <u>www.rorys.com.au</u> or from the menu in the Canteen.

Senior students can also purchase from a great selection of hot and cold foods from the displays at recess and lunch. Full EFTPOS facilities are available in the Canteen.

#### **BUS SERVICES**

Registration for the 2019 Bus services is now available by downloading the Passenger form from the College website.

Beginning in 2019 all buses will be fitted with the Bus Minder System. The BusMinder Parent App can be downloaded from the Apple App Store (for Apple devices) or Google Play (for Android devices). After downloading the 'BusMinder Parent' app and signing in, parents can make payment, choose to receive notifications as the student boards and leaves the bus, as well as seeing, on a Google map, the location of the bus. Students who travel on a Tatachilla bus services must register their Student ID Card or purchase a fob keyring from the main office to be used to tap on and off the bus. (\*Keyfobs are available from the College office for \$5.00)

Due to delays in delivery of the Busminder hardware for the first weeks of school all bus drivers will have a list of registered passengers and will mark off names on entry to the bus on each journey. Notification will be sent as soon as the new hardware is available.

Payment for Term 1 Bus Services is now due with payment to be received no later than Friday 1 February. Payment can be made in person, by phone or through the College online store at <u>https://store.tatachilla.sa.edu.au/collections/bus-tickets</u>.

Bookings for all bus travel is essential and must be done prior to payment or travel.




When first accessing our school you will be prompted to add a student profile for your child. This allows you to make orders and payments for them. If you have made a purchase you can select our school from 'Previous Location'
