MATHS OLYMPIAD

Throughout 2019 a group of selected Junior School students in Years 5 and 6 took part in the Australasian Problem Solving Mathematics Olympiads



(APSMO) program. These selected students represented the school in a series of five challenges each month from May to September against other schools across Australia, New Zealand and neighbouring countries. There were over 34,000 students that took part in the challenges this year.

Whilst very challenging in nature, these competitions gave students the opportunity to explore how to apply known knowledge to mathematical problem-solving situations and use rich mathematical language. They have developed stronger mathematical connections by comparing the different methods of solution with their peers. We are so proud of your achievements and how each student have begun to apply mathematical knowledge in different situations. These students should be commended for their efforts as team Tatachilla.

Each member of team Tatachilla received a participation certificate and the following students are recognised for their individual performance:

Eli Roder (6A) and Henry Pritchard (6A) have both been recognised for their joint highest individual scores over all five mathematical challenges for team Tatachilla as well as the outstanding achievement of being in the top 2% of students that took part in the program. Mason Gregor (6A) attained a score that was in the top 10% of students; Josiah Mitchell (6A) and Patrick McDonald (6C) attained a score that was in the top 25% of students; Amy Hrstich (6C) and Friedrich Hillen (5C) attained a score that was in the top 50% of students across the program.

As the end of the academic year fast

approaches, the pace for students can seem to increase with lots still to be done to finish the year well. Currently our Year 12 students are sitting their SACE examinations. These important assessments conclude on Friday 15 November. We wish our graduating students success in their examinations. SACE results will be published on 17 December. Students and parents are reminded that these results are accessible only through the SACE website. Students are encouraged to check access to the site ahead of the release date to ensure

that they will be able to see their results.

Year 10 and 11 students are completing assessments in the coming weeks prior to revision week and examination week for the conclusion of the semester. Year 11 revision week begins next week with examinations commencing on Tuesday 19 November. Year 11s will have a study day on Monday 18 November before examinations begin on Tuesday 19 November. Please note that Year 11s are welcome to use the library for study during this week when they do not have an examination. However, attendance for the full week is not compulsory. Students are reminded that they are to attend examinations in full College uniform.

Year 10 revision week begins on Monday 18 November in Week 6 and examinations begin on Tuesday 26 November. Year 10 students are expected to attend school full time for all of Week 6 and Week 7. We wish all of our students success in their examinations.

The final phase of our term focuses on preparation for 2020 with transition. This period is customised to the needs of individual year levels. Current Year 9 students will experience transition day on Thursday 5 December and visit their Year 10 Home Class Teacher in Home Class time during this week also. Transition week occurs for our current Year 11s in for the full week of Week 7 – Monday 25 to Friday 29 November. Year 10 students will experience transition in Week 8 with Monday to Wednesday as compulsory and Thursday and Friday as optional depending upon alternative short courses offered by the College.

We hold Summer School in Week 8 for all Senior School students who would like to complete their holiday homework or use the time for additional preparation for 2020 while teachers are available for advice and assistance. There is increasing uptake of this opportunity. Students seem to appreciate the chance to finalise work immediately after it has been set so that they can enjoy a well-deserved break knowing they have completed required tasks.

Six Brushtailed Bettongs were caught; three males and three females, and one with a small joey in the pouch. New microchips were inserted in three of the bettongs which were given the names, Bones, Hedwig and Rajmina. Seven year old Longnosed Potoroo, Savannah was also caught, a good age for a pottoroo. According to our records, Savannah was first microchipped 30 Nov 2012. Visitors managed to catch a glimpse of Ron, one of the Tammar Wallabies. The evening ended with supplementary feeding of fauna with fruit and veg scraps from the Junior School. It was a perfect evening for all involved.
