## from the **PRINCIPAL**

ACARA (Assessment, Curriculum and Reporting Authority) have recently undertaken a review of the Australian Curriculum from Reception to Year 10. This review identified that the Australian Curriculum is consistent with some of the best curricula internationally and is well-regarded by teachers across the country; but that it needs refining, updating and 'decluttering' to better support teachers. Our College staff will review these changes in Term 2 and offer feedback back to ACARA. Mrs Gina Kadis is also undertaking a simultaneous audit of the Year 7-12 College Curriculum.

The audit will ensure we continuously improve the depth and breadth of subject offerings, refine subject selection processes and ensure quality and contemporary staff professional development opportunities.

I congratulate Mrs Elizabeth Bentley and Mrs Rachel Overstreet and all staff, students, Old Scholars and community members involved with the 2021 College production of *The Addams Family*. The following email received from one of our community members encapsulates the success of the production;

## from the head of **JUNIOR SCHOOL**

### **WELCOME TO TERM 2**

Autumn is the best time of year in my view. One reason is it is the only time of the year that my neighbour's towering lemon scented gum tree isn't

dropping leaves, bark, gum nuts, flowers or branches into our courtyard or onto our roof. It

is a beautiful, tall tree, with mottled grey and white bark and gracious trunk

and branches, providing shelter and food for the many parrots, magpies and crows that visit it. Unfortunately, it is sandwiched between a commercial building on one side, and a row of townhouses on the other, with paving and bitumen all around. Despite being planted in this unsuitable position, it has proved resilient over the last 40 years, and endured all forms of weather, and some enthusiastic pruning by adjacent building owners to try and keep it in check. Sadly, approval has been granted for it to be removed. A few years ago it was struck by lightning and has been deemed a risk that the local council is not prepared to take.

Trees, and this tree in particular with its never ending shower of leaves, nuts, flowers and bark, remind me that change is inevitable and futile to resist, not just in nature, but in our bodies, our families and our professional lives; and now with the impending removal of the tree, I'll be tested on that. The writer of Ecclesiastes 3:1 says *"There is a time for everything, and a season for every activity under the heavens"*. As we move into Term 2, I hope the inevitable changes ahead are beneficial for you and your family.

### **YEAR 3 AND 5 NAPLAN TESTING IN WEEKS 3 AND 4**

Part of our College's obligations under the Australian Education Act 2013 is for students in Years 3 and 5 to participate in the National Assessment Program: Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN). The scheduled test period is from Tuesday 11 May - Friday 21 May.

The results provide valuable data about the performance of individual students and will be reported to parents/caregivers. The College will also receive data that allows us to compare the performance of the year level against national standards and will help us to monitor the longitudinal attainment of students as they move through the College.

This assessment will take place in your child's home classroom and is all online this year. Students must bring their fully charged iPads and be at their classroom promptly at 8:40am so that they can be seated in time for the tests to start.

### **UNIFORM REMINDER**

For students wearing the old uniform, next week is the last week of the transition from summer to winter uniform. Thereafter, all students should be in their full winter kit. Junior School students may wear the soft-shell sports jacket over their uniform to keep warm and dry.

Students in the new uniform can continue to wear a combination of items to suit the weather conditions. New cold weather clothing will be in stock in the Uniform Shop in the coming weeks, including the puffer vest and new look soft-shell jacket. The rugby top is to be worn with the PE uniform only. Thank you for sending your children to school scrubbed, polished and buttoned up. They have been looking very smart.

While we have an extreme weather policy and bring children in under cover at lunch and afternoon tea if it is raining heavily, when it looks like a passing shower, we persevere and hope it does, indeed, pass.



### **TEMPORARY EXEMPTION OR ABSENCE FROM SCHOOL**

Where a child is going to be away from school for a family holiday or for another reason for a known period of time, the Junior School Office and the child's teacher should be notified. The office staff will forward an exemption application form ED175 Form A for the family to complete and return to the school prior to the period of absence. Regular attendance at school is important to a child's learning and development so they get the most from their education. Ensuring regular attendance at school is a shared responsibility between parents and the College. We appreciate your cooperation in this matter.

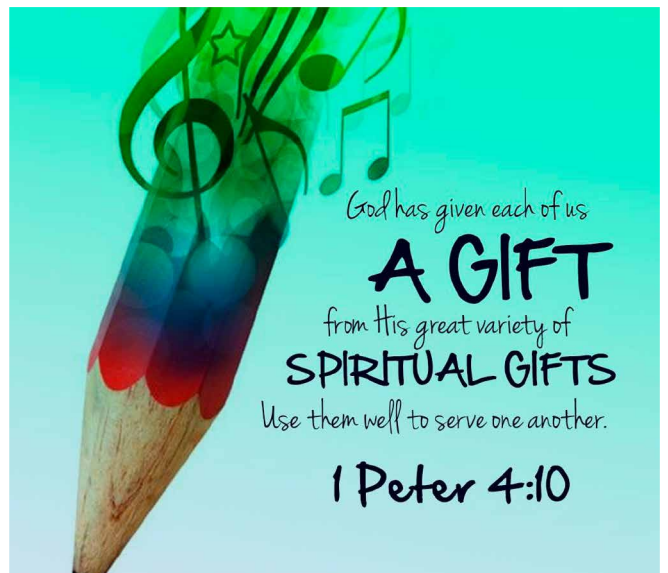
When I see young people using their talents and voice in the present moment they are living and realise they don't have to wait to be older to do this; it is inspirational.

## SAPSASA DISTRICT CROSS COUNTRY

Friday 30 April turned on the perfect weather for an exciting District Cross Country event which is held annually at the Noarlunga Downs Primary School. With the event cancelled in 2020 due to COVID-19 it was a welcome sign of things gradually returning to normal for our students who competed this year. Students compete as individuals for placings as well as for the team event. Team events can be entered when there are a minimum of three students representing their school in that division.

Incorporating fitness and wellbeing into our PE Curriculum, Tatachilla was successfully able to enter individual competitors across the ages of Under 13 - Under 10 in both male and female categories and team events in all but the 12 and 13 year old girls. 13 Year Old Boys – 2nd

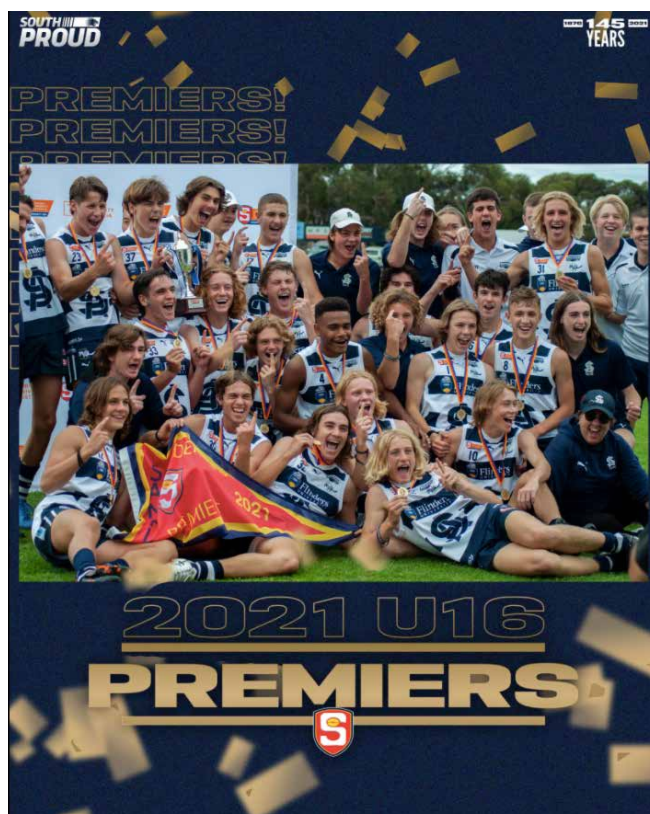
